History of the Games (Eachdraidh nan Gèam)

The 'Inter-Island' Games were born in the Isle of Man in 1985, with the intention of bringing together a number of small islands from different parts of the world in friendly competition as part of the Isle of Man's Year of Sport.

Athletes came from as far afield as Iceland and Scandinavia in the northern hemisphere, the British Isles, the Mediterranean, down to St. Helena in the South Atlantic. In total 15 islands took part.

The idea was to provide an opportunity for hundreds of young sportsmen and women from small island communities, to compete and enjoy international competition against other islanders with similar standards of performance. Other benefits of such a unique festival of sport are the opportunities for cultural exchange and social interaction with visiting teams, and to establish new lifelong friendships with fellow islanders.

In many ways, sporting competition is only one aspect of the success of this event. As important are the opportunities it affords to share thoughts and experiences relating to our unique island stories. With that in mind, the theme for our advertising has been NatWest – bringing islands together.

The Festival was such a success that it was agreed to continue it every other year, with Guernsey hosting the Games in 1987. The Games have subsequently been held in the Faroe Islands, Åland, Isle of Wight, Gibraltar, Jersey, Gotland in 1999 (the first Games of NatWest offshore's sponsorship), Isle of Man, Guernsey, Shetland and Rhodes. The Western Isles have competed in both the Shetland and Rhodes Games.

The number of Islands participating has grown substantially, and now 25 Islands are members of the International Island Games Association.



Åland

Åland is located strategically in the Baltic Sea in between Finland and Sweden. The highest part of Åland started rising from the sea some 10,000 years ago and as a result of the land rise Åland gradually grows. Island after island rose from the sea and when the first inhabitants came to Åland the land area was about 25 km². The land elevation is ongoing and currently Åland is about 1500 km².

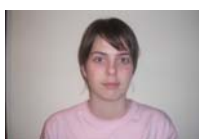

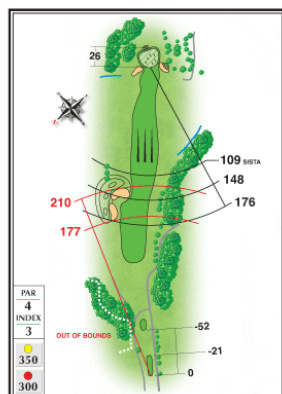

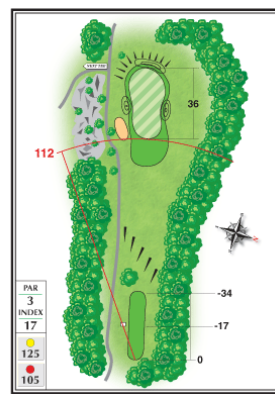

Last Word From WIIGA (Facal san Dealachadh bho CGEnES)

After successes at both the Shetland and Rhodes Games, the Western Isles Squad will depart for Aland on 27th June buzzing with high hopes and soaring enthusiasm.

It's an exciting time for the Western Isles squad, with the pressure on to improve on the impressive cache of medals they took home from Rhodes, the hardest Games we've attended so far, given the scorching heat and the distracting beaches, swimming pools and the sights and sounds of the Faliraki nightlife!

Our squad did us proud and we hope that this year will be no different!

Flying direct by Charter on 27th June from Stornoway to Mariehamn will be a total squad of 78 (including Team Managers and General Officials). On arrival we will take part in the Official Opening Ceremony where over 3000 competitors from all over the world will March through the streets of Mariehamn.

The squad returns home on 5th July, hopefully with their bags loaded with medals! I'm sure that they will have enjoyed the experience and will have embraced the idea of the event—the Friendly Games.

Le còrr air 3,200 lùth-chleasaiche bho 25 coinhearsnachd bho thimcheall an t-saoghail a gabhail pàirt ann an 25 diofar spòrs, se àm togarrach a tha seo do Sgioba nan Eilean Siar. Ach, that impidh orra tilleadh dhachaigh le fiù barrachd bhuinn nan ultach a thug iad dhachaigh à Rhodes—agus cha b'e geamaichean furasta a bha sin, bha an teas sàraichte, na tràighean agus amaran snàmh cho tarraingeach, agus sin gun guth a thoirt air na bha gabhail àite gach feasgar ann an Faliraki!

Tha sinn pròiseil as ar sgioba agus tha sinn cinnteach gu soirbhich leotha a cheart cho math am bliadhna.

Nuair a ruigeas sinn, gabhaidh a h-uile duine pàirt ann am Fàilteachas Fosgladh Oifigeil far am bi còrr air 3000 farpaiseach bho air feadh an t-saoghail a caismeachd tro shràidean Mariehamn. Se an fhèileadh a bhios air mòran de la gillean—tha sinn an dòchas nach fhairich iad fuachd!!
